*"I live in Armenia with my mother, my aunt and my grandmother," Zabel\* says. "I have no brothers or sisters, and I don't know my father. I was very little when he left us, and we never saw him again."*

In 2025, Zabel joined a summer children's camp — led by ministry leaders trained and supported by Reach A Village — for the first time. *"Before I went to the camp, I didn't listen to my mom," Zabel says. "I lied a lot, and I was disobedient. I felt jealous of children who talked about their fathers, or played with their brothers and sisters."*

During the camp, Zabel made new friends. And she learned about God's rules for living in peace and about the love of Jesus.

Attending the camp has given Zabel a new life. *"Now, my new friends are like my brothers and sisters," she says. "I am respectful to my mother. When I feel I might say a lie, I stay silent. I even tell my friends how wonderful it is when you don't lie, when you are not angry, and when you feel peace inside. For the first time, I have this happy feeling, and it is amazing."*

Now, Zabel knows Jesus and has her Heavenly Father with her. *"Even though my earthly father isn't here, I have my Heavenly Father who helps me overcome difficulties," she says. "I pray a lot, and I am sure my Heavenly Father will never leave me."*

## Alive in Christ

After fleeing the violence in his family home, Vasily\* grew up in an orphanage. At age 16, he entered a vocational school to become a tailor. *"That's when my bad habits flourished," he says. "I was smoking, drinking and using drugs."*

When his studies ended, he was on the street, drifting and plagued by his addictions. He began stealing. At age 22, he was convicted of his crimes and sent to prison, where he worked as a tailor.

*"One day, a man named Max brought me a jacket to be mended," Vasily says. "He was holding a Bible in his hands. I ignored him when he began to talk about Jesus."* Eight months later, Vasily encountered Max again when Max was reading the Bible aloud to a group of men. This time, Vasily listened.

When Vasily was released from prison, he remembered his addictions and forgot about Jesus. But Jesus kept working in his life. One day, Vasily was seeking food and shelter. God led him to a church, where he heard the Gospel once again. One of the ministry leaders—trained by Reach A Village—talked with him about Jesus, and then took him to a home Bible study group.

*"My soul became peaceful again," Vasily says. "I came back to the group every week. I began to study God's Word on my own, too, using the Bible they gave me. For the first time in many years, I feel alive."*

*My life in Cambodia felt like a heavy shadow," Thida says. "I was constantly struggling with family tensions, overwhelming debt, and a deep sense of loneliness. Every day was a battle. I felt isolated and adrift."*

Thida's entire existence revolved around survival. She worked hard in the fields under the relentless sun during the day. In the evenings, she took on any labor job she could find. *"I lived without a single glimpse of hope," she says. "My heart was aching."*

One day, a local follower of Jesus came to her home. *"He spoke a name I had never heard before," Thida says. "That name is Jesus. He explained to me how much Jesus loves me."*

As he spoke, Thida began to realize that she is a sinner who needs God's love to save her. *"For the first time, my heart felt a flicker of something other than fear," she says. "At that moment, I accepted Jesus as my Savior."* A group of local believers in the village welcomed Thida to join them for worship, prayer and Bible study.

*"The change in my life is a miracle," Thida says. "The constant anxiety that once gripped me has been replaced by a deep, unexplainable peace. I am grateful to the teacher and the local believers in my village who never give up on sharing the Good News. They brought me out of the shadows and into His glorious light."*
